IN HUM 300H, WE ARE LEARNING ABOUT WHAT IT TAKES TO BE TRULY CREATIVE. THE BOOK THAT WE ARE READING FOR THE COURSE IS CREATIVITY: THE PSYCHOLOGY OF DISCOVERY AND INVENTION BY MIHALY CSIKSZENTMIHALYI. ACCORDING TO THE AUTHOR, CREATIVITY CAN ONLY OCCUR IF ONE HAS BECOME AN EXPERT ON A SINGLE TOPIC. YOU MUST COMPLETELY UNDERSTAND THE INS AND OUTS OF A TOPIC BEFORE SOMETHING NEW CAN BE CREATED. MIHALY USES THE EXAMPLE OF ASTRONOMER VERA RUBIN. HER PASSION AND ENJOYMENT CAME FROM STUDYING THE GALAXY, WHICH PROVIDED HER WITH THE PATIENCE AND ENDURANCE THAT REQUIRED HER TO BECOME AN EXPERT ON THE SUBJECT BEFORE SHE COULD MAKE ADVANCES AND DEVELOP THEORIES ON SUBJECTS SUCH AS DARK MATTER. SHE SPENT HER ENTIRE LIFE STUDYING ASTRONOMY. FOR THIS BOOK, MIHALY INTERVIEWED 91 HIGHLY CREATIVE PEOPLE LIKE VERA RUBIN TO DISCOVER WHAT IT TAKES TO BE CREATIVE.

HAVE YOU EVER BEEN SO WRAPPED UP IN AN ACTIVITY THAT TIME STOPS EXISTING? THIS IS FLOW. A CONCEPT THAT MIHALY DISCUSSES IN THE BOOK THAT COMES HAND IN HAND WITH CREATIVITY. FLOW OCCURS WHEN YOU DO SOMETHING THAT CAPTIVATES YOUR INTEREST AND IMAGINATION SO THAT YOU LOSE TRACK OF TIME AND CAN THINK DEEPLY ABOUT THE SUBJECT. THERE ARE MANY WAYS TO EXPERIENCE FLOW. ATHLETES, ARTISTS, RESEARCHERS, AND SCIENTISTS MAY ALL EXPERIENCE FLOW IN DIVERSE WAYS. AN ATHLETE MIGHT DISCONNECT FROM THE EXHAUSTION OR PAIN THEY FEEL, FOCUS ON THE FUNDAMENTALS, OR GET CAUGHT UP IN THE RHYTHM, AND LOSE TRACK OF TIME. THIS IS HOW SOME ELITE ATHLETES PUSH THROUGH LONG RACES FAST OR FEEL REJUVENATED IN THE MIDDLE OF A HARD GAME. ARTISTS CAN GET CAUGHT UP IN THE VISION OF THE PAINTING, THE EXECUTION OF THE PROJECT, AND THE CHANGES THAT COME WITH A BRUSHSTROKE SO THAT ALL SENSE OF TIME IS LOST. SCIENTISTS AND RESEARCHERS WORK ON ACQUIRING SO MUCH KNOWLEDGE ON THEIR SUBJECT THAT ONCE THE TIME COMES TO DO AN EXPERIMENT OR WRITE ABOUT RESEARCH. THERE IS ENOUGH INFORMATION IN THEIR MIND FOR THEM TO EXECUTE, NO PAUSE IS REQUIRED. FLOW COMES THROUGH LOVE AND ENJOYMENT OF THE ACTIVITY BEING DONE. IT IS SOMETHING I OFTEN DO WHEN I NEED TO ORGANIZE MY THOUGHTS. FINALLY, WHEN I READ A BOOK (FOR ENJOYMENT) I GET CAUGHT UP IN THIS NEW WORLD AND THE IMAGES IN MY HEAD THAT I FORGET ALL ABOUT LIFE. 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
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
